Our Work

Autism Spectrum Conditions Report Published

We have now published our report on the work we have carried out over the last 18 months, gathering feedback from people with Autism Spectrum Conditions and their carers. We have also been looking at current levels of awareness and understanding of Autism within GP practices, hospitals and other health services in Worcestershire.

The report sets out recommendations in relation to the priorities within the Worcestershire All Age Autism Strategy. Recommendations include:

- ❖ **Access to health services** - suggestions about how GP practices and hospitals can make it easier for people with Autism to make appointments, wait to be seen and communicate at appointments.
- ❖ **Awareness of Autism Spectrum Conditions** - increasing awareness amongst health professionals by encouraging and promoting training and identifying Autism Champions.
- ❖ **Information** - providing comprehensive information about services and support available.
- ❖ **Support** - increasing the provision for local support groups.
- ❖ **Diagnosis** - reducing waiting times and providing better information.

We have asked those responsible for running health and care services for a response to our recommendations and how the actions will be implemented. We will continue to carry out work on Autism Spectrum Conditions looking at the implementation of the recommendations.

NHS 111 Report Published

We have also now published our report on NHS 111. We gathered feedback from over 500 people about their experiences and awareness of NHS 111, through a survey and group engagement.

Our findings suggest that there is a good overall awareness of the NHS 111 service and that the majority of people who have used NHS 111 feel they have received a good service.

However, there is not such a good understanding of the range of services NHS 111 provides and concerns have been raised about the quality of service received in some cases, particularly in relation to the time taken to respond and the questions asked.

We have made recommendations about how awareness of NHS 111 and the quality and effectiveness of NHS 111 can be improved from a patient perspective.

Going to the Dentist

As well as raising awareness of the role of Healthwatch Worcestershire, we have been talking to students about the importance of gathering patient feedback and co-production. We have been gathering their feedback about NHS 111, emotional well-being services for young people and going to the Dentist.

Wyre Forest - Cancer Services Focus Groups


