





## Community Led Research and Engagement Project



One year project to:

- Explore what health and care research means to seldom heard communities
- Understand how health research needs to be done differently
- Actively involve communities in co-producing research
- Co-design a training resource to undertake their own research
- Create a network of Research Community Champions



## Fuller and the Community Led Research Project Development opportunities

#### Developing neighbourhood level 'teams of teams':

PCNs will be able to utilise VCSE networks as part of their evolving approach to neighbourhood integration, engaging the sector by area of interest and increase potential for more collaboration and capacity.

#### Delivering continuity of care by improving personalised care services:

This project will provide a model for establishing personalised requirements, particularly for vulnerable and hard to reach communities that are not engaging with current methods.

#### Preventative care, using primary care to create healthier communities:

Community-led research can be used as part of holistic approaches to improving people's understanding of and ability to engage with preventative action in groups at higher risk of poor health.

#### Three key enablers of change: workforce, estates, and data:

Training modules will support upskilling and capacity building in the workforce around collecting, collating and analysing qualitative data on a local level, providing a more detailed insight on nationally recognised issues.
